It was over 80 years ago that the Dutchess Philharmonic Community Orchestra was founded by four local amateur musicians, and 60 years ago that conductor Claude Monteux elevated the orchestra to a fully-professional ensemble, renaming it the Hudson Valley Philharmonic. This season also represents the HVP's 21st year under Bardavon management and the 27th under the music direction of conductor Randall Craig Fleischer.
