WORKSHOP EPISODES MATERIALS NEEDED

Bunraku Workshop Materials:

- Piece of paper towel
- A few pieces of "bigger paper": brown paper that comes in shipping boxes or brown paper bags opened up, or wrapping paper, or butcher paper, or newspaper (if these items are not available copy paper can be used, the puppet will just be a bit smaller, which is fine)
- Stapler or tape (any type)
- Marker or crayon
- *Optional:* Scissors
- *Optional:* Scrap paper



Mask Workshop Materials:

We make three mask options in the video. Viewers can make one or all three masks. If someone wants to make all three they will use all three mask base options.

- Mask base (need at least one of these options)
 - A disposable medical mask
 - Piece of paper (copy paper, lined paper, cardstock, construction paper)
 - Paper plate
- Tape or glue
- Scissors
- Markers or crayons
- Something to tie the mask to one's face: string or twine or piece of a rag/cloth, or extra disposable medical mask.
- **Bonus:** a hole punch can really help if string is being used.

Tenement Living Workshop Materials:

- No materials needed!

TIME TRAVELER EPISODE ONE
